Using pictures to promote health

Australia - Child and Adolescent Health Service: Picture my Participation

SUMMARY OF PROJECT

"Picture my Participation" is a paediatric self-report tool – currently available in English and developed in

Australia, Canada, South Africa, Sweden, Uganda, and Vietnam - that uses pictures to discuss health-

related topics for children aged 5–17 in various contexts and settings. The tool identifies frequencies, levels

of involvement, and barriers and facilitators to a child's participation in home, school, and community

settings. The aim of the project is to develop an appropriate instrument to measure the level of

participation of children with disabilities in low and middle income (LAMI) countries and other

marginalised communities.

FACTS & FIGURES

About 80% of the world's persons with disabilities live in the 145 low and middle income countries.

Pilots of the tool, including feedback from children with disabilities, have been administered on

three continents; and there is evidence that the tool can be used in various settings, cultural

environments, and countries.

The tool will be made available to all children with disabilities living in LAMI countries.

PROBLEMS TARGETED

Currently, there is only limited knowledge about the participation outcomes of children and youth living in

low and middle-income countries, mostly because of a shortage of tools to measure their participation and

the inadequacy of existing ones. Even though many countries are working to improve their health care

services and to give people with disabilities access to them, there is still a lack of data concerning children

with disabilities that could be used to improve their situation in LAMI countries.

SOLUTION & METHODOLOGY

"Picture my Participation" uses pictures to identify the frequencies of a child's participation, for example,

through the collection of data on how often someone goes to school, the level of involvement and barriers,

as well as factors that facilitate the participation of a child in different contexts. Using simple language -

without jargon and technical expressions - the tool allows children to tell their own stories about their

level of participation in their homes, their communities, and in educational settings. The pictures, which

are used within the process and can be adapted to various cultural contexts, are intended to support

discussion and understanding of the assessment, which consists of six steps and takes about 20 minutes to

complete.

OUTLOOK & TRANSFERABILITY

In 2015, the application will be refined and piloted and psychometric testing will be completed. The tool,

including a learning package, will be fully implemented by the end of 2018 in all 145 LAMI countries in

Spanish, Arab, Chinese, English, French, and Russian. Furthermore, global awareness of the rights of

children with disabilities will be increased through the provision of strategies to improve participation.

Because the application is available online and the tool is largely image based, it can be translated into

other languages and used worldwide.
